## Mid-America Union Policy

The minimum number of school days in the school year shall be 180 or more if the state law requires. 175 of which must be teacher-student instructional days.

A school day consists of a minimum if six hours, excluding lunch period. The Friday school may be adjusted as long as the weekly schedule provides 30+ hours. This calendar provides 178 actual school days. Variations or changes in this calendar must be approved by the Conference Office of Education. In the event of emergency closing, notify the Conference Office of Education.
